



The avalanche path is more obvious from a distance, but not from the road. Daisy Pass is up to the road to the left of the picture. Due to a reloading of the slope and a [HIGH](#) avalanche danger we were unable to hike up and investigate the snowpack. We are unsure if this slide was a natural or human triggered.
